


Trump and the Wolff


A fiery reception from Trump

The Wolff Claims

Part of the reason for the controversy surrounding the book's publication is due to some of the major allegations that came out of it.

With these claims came major backlash from the White House, due to such claims as 'The first woman president, Ivanka entertained, would not be Hillary Clinton, it would be Ivanka Trump', as well as the claim that Donald Trump and 'his tiny band of

campaign warriors' did not believe or plan to win, and were in fact shocked and some even upset when Trump's victory was announced, with Melania Trump supposedly being 'in tears - and not of joy'.

Other claims within the book that have been met with such controversy include the claims that Donald Trump did not actually enjoy his inauguration, that he found the White House scary, and that he also would pursue friend's wives and would trick the wives husbands into saying negative things about their wife, while the wife was listening to the conversation on a speakerphone.

Sebastian Gorka, ex-deputy assistant to Donald Trump as President, stated in a contentious interview with Newsnight that he did not recognise any of the claims made in the book, stating that some of the claims were 'Garbage!' and that 'this is a joke'.
